Niños School Update

There is a lot to report this Quarter on the School Update! First, the kids had so much fun on their field trip to the Zoo. The 480 students were split up into 2 groups; the younger students went to the Zoo the first day, and the older went to the zoo the second day. Both groups had a wonderful time; they loved being able to leave their hometown, take a bus into the city and spend the day with their friends at the zoo.

The students had so much fun walking around and seeing all different kinds of animals. One of the younger groups loved howling at the wolves in hope for a howl back! The wolves, of course, did not but that did not stop their excitement. Later that day, the little ones then witnessed feeding time with the snakes! The crowd favorite for everyone were the penguins which they



were able to watch playing in their glass aquarium. It was impossible to keep the groups moving forward to see the next animals!



The Basico (middle school) students received free tickets to use the big slides! This was perfect for this group of students as most took the

opportunity right away! One student climbed to the top of the slide with the intention of sliding down on her potato sack. Upon reaching the top with friends, she froze with fear. She couldn't make the move to slide down the giant slide! After some time of having her class cheer her down and give her encouragement, she finally made the move and made it down!

Niños School Update continued...



The next update is equally exciting! Elections were held for student body government on Friday June 9th! The students have been campaigning for the last month so there was a lot of excitement around these elections. This is the first year that the schools have implemented student body government and both the staff and students are looking forward to this new activity.

Each grade had a specific plan they turned in for the election process. There is now one president for each grade and one president to lead this group who will

make up the Student Government at each school. They will be working on formulating a unified plan soon!

The overall responsibilities of the student government are as follows:

- Organize activities to benefit the school; community involvement, classroom learning, raising funds to gain resources for the school
- Take charge of the participation and learning of the students
- Take responsibility that all students get to class on time and finish the school year without dropping out
- Take responsibility in fulfilling all rights and duties of the student body
- Propose and develop an annual plan
- Present a report of the work that was done at the end of the year

Chica Spotlight

At Ninos de Guatemala (NDG) one of the requirements for the students to attend is their mothers have to volunteer at the school doing various activities. This Quarter we wanted to spotlight one of the Mom's of the girls we sponsor! Andrea Carron, Padrino Coordinator at Ninos, spoke with **Maria Angelica**, the mother of three students; two are enrolled in Nuestro Futuro and the oldest is in his last year of Basico. She is the mom of Dulce Maria Gómez Piche, Pilar Fitgerald's ahijada.

Maria Angelica lives in Ciudad Vieja, which is about a 10-15 minute walk from the school. She studied up until 4th grade and then stopped when her mother told her it was time that she started working. She usually works around the house taking care of the children, but during coffee season she works in the coffee fields and really enjoys it! While her husband normally works in construction (hired labor), he is out of work right now.

Maria Angelica speaks very highly of the Padrino program and the excitement it brings to her children. She described the Padrinos as special friends for her children. She mentioned that when they get letters, they bring them home and show them to her. She is very grateful for all of the support the Padrinos provide for her children's education.



Maria Angelica feels very proud and lucky that her children attend the NDG schools. In comparison to the public schools in the area, the children receive extra classes like English and computer classes at no extra cost for the family. Her two children in Nuestro Futuro stay after class many times and sign up to help clean in return for extra computer time. She also mentioned that the NDG schools are more reliable, unlike the public schools as many times classes are cancelled for teacher strikes or other varying reasons. At the NDG schools, her children are encouraged to go after their dreams; another point she says is unique. Her fourth grade daughter wants to be a doctor or an elementary school teacher, her second son wants to be a firefighter, and her oldest son wants to become a lawyer. Not only are the teachers encouraging her children to reach for their dreams but also, with the help of the parenting school at NDG, she and her husband have learned to support these dreams too.

Maria Angelica also shared she has been caring for another student at the school. This young girl's mother passed away and is now being raised by her father. Because her father works in Quiche, another department of Guatemala (about 6 hours away driving), he has to leave for days at a time leaving the student and her siblings to care for themselves. Maria Angelica spoke with the father and offered to take care of his daughter until he can find work closer to home. "Even if all we can afford are beans and tortillas for dinner, she will at least have the love of a family around her".

One of the last things Maria Angelica mentioned was the following: "We [as parents] have to fight for the dreams of our children because that is what is left."



Amigas Connection Club

Amigas Connection is a new girl's service club we are offering to 4 schools in Charlotte this fall. We are starting out small with hopes to expand over the next 3 - 5 years. The purpose of the clubs is to build connections between girls in the U.S. and our partner schools in Guatemala and to raise funds to support education while doing it. Small groups of middle and high school girls will participate in 18 sessions over the course of the school year, facilitated by their teachers. Students will exchange communications and cultural experiences and get to know each other through Skype. The U.S. clubs will also have lessons in financial planning to learn how to develop a fundraiser, which will benefit their amigas in Guatemala.

In March, we met with our school partner administrators in Guatemala to introduce the new club concept, and in July, we will meet with the students. Stay tuned!
