BFB Foundation Board Member, Jennifer Jackson, has been involved with the foundation since 2011 when she started sponsoring a student in the Padrino Mentor program at our partner school, Niños de Guatemala.

"I had been looking for ways to step outside myself and my world to try to make a difference in the lives of others. BFB Foundation gave me that opportunity when I started sponsoring a little girl named Odeth in the Padrino (Mentor) program." After she was elected to the Foundation Board in 2017. Jennifer made a visit to Guatemala along with her photographer cousin, Kathleen Greeson, where they "shadowed" two girls in the Niños de Guatemala program. Inspired to bring visibility and awareness to the program, Jennifer came back with a very personal - and visual - account of her experiences to share with the BFB Foundation community and beyond.

Scholarships program was established in 2015 for girls at Instituto Indigena Nuestra Señora del Socorro, our partner high school in Antigua, Guatemala.

With your help, our fall fundraiser raised over \$12,000, which has allowed us to extend scholarship support to 21 University students currently (\$500 each for the whole year including tuition, books, transportation and lodging). This fall, we are expanding the number of scholarships to include girls in another Socorro partner school in nearby San Andres (Solola), Guatemala.

We have also hired a full-time **Academic Advisor** in Guatemala to serve as a resource for the current and prospective scholarship students. We are pleased to welcome Mishelle Rodriguez to the BFB Foundation team!

Our pilot clubs between middle and high school girls (in Guatemala and Charlotte) was a great success! The students at Charlotte Country Day School and Charlotte Catholic High School (pictured below) raised \$1,446.24 and every penny will go to our partner schools, Nino de Guatemala and Socorro! Thanks to all four schools for participating in the club's first year (Trinity Episcopal and Charlotte Christian were the other two in the U.S.). Girls communicated through Google Hangouts and shared experiences about their schools.
